Step 1: Reflect on the Text

Read the Scripture printed above. What stands out to you? What do you find interesting and/or important? What is challenging or causes you to have questions?

Step 2: Reflect on the Sermon

INTRODUCTION

- 1. When you have to apologize for something, do you, even unwittingly, use words like "mistake" or "accident"? How might your repentance be deepened by using a word like "sin" to describe your wrongdoings?
- 2. What was your one, big takeaway from the sermon? How would you summarize the main theme of the sermon in one phrase or sentence?

SIN (vv. 3-6)

- 1. Why is it that David sees his sin primarily against God? In your own words, explain the relational aspect of sin.
- 2. What would be some of the effects of understanding the depth of your sinfulness? How would you treat others differently?

REPENTANCE (vv. 1-2, 7-9)

- 1. How does repentance fix our sin problem?
- 2. What does a reluctance to confess your sins reveal about what you believe about God or who you believe him to be?

Step 3: Final Reflections

- 1. How has your understanding, appreciation, and love for Jesus and the gospel grown as a result of this study?
- 2. In what areas of faith and practice are you feeling convicted by the Holy Spirit to act as a result of this study?
