Step 1: Reflect on the Text

Read the Scripture printed above. What stands out to you? What do you find interesting and/or important? What is challenging or causes you to have questions?

Step 2: Reflect on the Sermon

INTRODUCTION

1. Have you ever heard of an “echo chamber?” Do you suspect that you might be in one?
2. What was your one, big takeaway from the sermon? How would you summarize the main theme of the sermon in one phrase or sentence?

WORD AND DEED (v. 6)

1. Have you ever been a part of a church that embraced one side or the other? What was our experience?
2. What are some of the harmful effects in a Christian’s witness if one or the other is absent?

NOW AND FUTURE (vv. 7-8, 20-21)

1. The healing of the crippled man is a foretaste of the future. How so?
2. Are you more likely to be more concerned with the present, or the future? How does this passage readjust your emphasis?

DEPRAVED AND ESTEEMED (vv. 12-18)

1. How does this passage show us that we are both depraved and esteemed?
2. Are you more prone to self-hatred, or arrogance? How can this truth help you in each case?

Step 3: Final Reflections

1. How has your understanding, appreciation, and love for Jesus and the gospel grown as a result of this study?
2. In what areas of faith and practice are you feeling convicted by the Holy Spirit to act as a result of this study?
