- 1. Why is it so significant that Luke (the author of Acts) highlights the conversion of Cornelius?
- 2. Cornelius began to serve and obey God before he ever met him. How is love an essential ingredient to faith that precedes reason?

CRAZY, UNLIKELY, GRACIOUS WELCOME OF GOD IN THE CONVERSION OF PETER (vv. 9-28)

- 1. Have you ever had an experience with the Lord, where a teaching of Christ "clicked" and finally made sense?
- 2. Have you seen food "divide"? What are other ways that our traditions as a "litmus" test for determining the "good" Christians?
