- 5) The deeper truth that protects the purity of love in marriage is the vow. How does the deeper truth of God's love for you, and God's love for the other, protect the purity of love despite lack of reciprocity?

CHRISTIAN LOVE IS MATURE

- 6) Can you think of an example of how you have grown and matured in your spiritual gift?
- 7) What does it look like for you to continue to cultivate your spiritual gifts to proclaim Jesus more clearly, and thus grow in a more mature love for others?
- 8) Do you think our spiritual gifts lovinging used in this way (pointing to Jesus) could actually change the world? Why?
