RECALL (VV 1-5)

- 2) What is your favorite story of deliverance from the Bible?
- 3) Can you recall a moment in your life now that hindsight is 20/20 where God was working for your good without your support or knowledge?
- 4) We need help remembering the deliverance we have in Jesus through his death and resurrection.
 - a) In what situations are you most likely to forget the gospel?
 - b) Can you think of anything you might do to help remember the gospel in these times?

ACT (VV 6-8)

- 5) The people in Micah's day would sacrifice anything, except themselves. What are some 'red flags' that your sacrifice is more like manipulation than love?
- 6) God cannot love you more than He already does and you cannot earn more through sacrifice because the greatest sacrifice was made without your input, help or knowledge. He loves you so much and we know that because you cost so much. What emotion do those statements bring to your heart?
- 7) Micah writes: "He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God." We do these things not to manipulate but out of hearts that remember what God has done for us.
 - a) What is one small step you can take this week to do justice?
 - b) What is one small step you can take this week to love kindness?
 - c) What is one small step you can take this week to walk humbly with your God?
